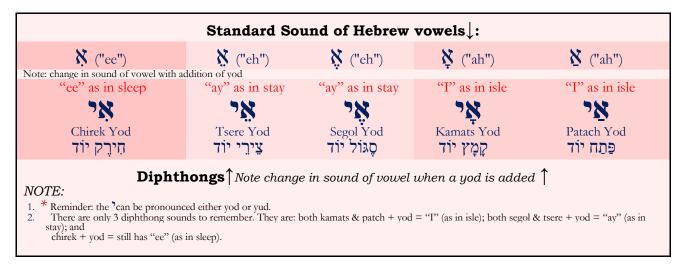

# 7.04 INTERESTING FACT: Did you know?

Generally, a "J" in English name is translated as a "yod/yud" in Hebrew. For example: Joseph in English is Yosef in Hebrew; Jacob, Yaakov; Jerusalem, Yerushalayim

#### 7.05 Introducing the dagesh & the dagesh kal

- 1. A dagesh is a dot within a consonant
  - There are two types of dagesh in Hebrew: dagesh kal & dagesh chazak
- 2. Dagesh kal (לְגַשׁׁ קֵל) is also called dagesh lene (or a weak dagesh)
  - Where is dagesh kal found? It is in 6 letters: ച, ג, ז, ב, ב, ז. BeGeD KeFeT (in Hebrew: גְּבֶּלֶגְ בֶּבֶּלֶגְ ) is the acronym for these letters. (Examples of acronyms in English are ASAP; FYI; )
    - o Note: in only 3 of these 6 letters does the dagesh kal actually change the sound: the ☐ changes to ☐; the ☐ to ☐; the ☐ to ☐.
  - What rules pertain to dagesh kal?
    - o It is found in the 1st letter of a word or in a consonant that opens a syllable.
    - O Dagesh kal never follows a full vowel.

#### Grammar-made-simple: בְּמִצְוֹתְיוּ

- 1. In the word (בְּמְצְוֹתֵין), the "tsade" has a sheva; the sheva closes the previous syllable.
  - a. In many ways this word is a "sight word."
    - i. Is the "vav" a consonant or part of a holam vav? It is the consonant vav & not part of the holam vav. We know because a syllable cannot begin with vowel (the holam vav, in this instance); therefore, this vav is be a consonant.
  - ii. What about the holam that is above the vav? It is a holam which floated over the vav. It should be to the left of the vav. So, the cholam gives the vav the V-oh sound.
- 2. The pronominal suffix 100 is pronounced "tahv". This pronominal suffix ending is 3rd person masculine singular & is translated as "his".
